In 2024, the two main exhibitions at the Zentrum Paul Klee are devoted to the artist Sarah Morris and the modern art of Brazil. In the context of the new permanent exhibition *Kosmos Klee*, attention will be devoted to the Egyptian artist Hamed Abdalla, avant-garde journals as well as Paul Klee's influence on architecture. An important topic of the exhibition programme is the networking and mutual inspiration of artists. Running alongside the exhibitions there will be a wide programme of concerts and readings.

In the spring, the exhibition *Sarah Morris*. *All Systems Fail* is the first one to present a comprehensive overview of the paintings and cinematic work of the New York-based artist **Sarah Morris**. In her works she engages with modernity and power, and examines which systems run through life in modern society. Her themes range from the architecture of major corporations to digital infrastructure. As well as her large-format abstract paintings, the Zentrum Paul Klee is showing her extensive work in film.

The autumn exhibition *Brasil! Brasil! The Dawn of Modernity* impressively demonstrates the extent to which Brazilian artists developed their own modern pictorial language in the first half of the 20th century. Both the European avant-garde and the country's own indigenous and afro-Brazilian cultures were important references. Aside from works by ten Brazilian artists, the exhibition provides a comprehensive introduction into the architecture, design, literature and music of the period.

Permanent exhibition Kosmos Klee and FOKUS exhibitions

In the context of the new permanent exhibition *Kosmos Klee*, the Zentrum Paul Klee is devoting one FOKUS room to exhibitions with a thematic reference to Paul Klee and his work. The FOKUS series 2024 opens with an exhibition on the Egyptian artist **Hamed Abdalla** (1917-1985). He engagedintensively with European modern art and Paul Klee in particular. Two additional FOKUS exhibitions address architecture and the journals of the avant-garde.

Music and literature

Alongside the exhibitions, the Zentrum Paul Klee is offering a varied programme of concerts and readings: the American pianist Claire Huangci and the Russian pianist Alexei Volodin, the American violinist Joshua Bell and the Israeli pianist Shai Wosner as well as the Alban Berg Ensemble Wien are part of a series of master concerts. In the first half of 2024 Gabriele von Arnim, Daniel Kehlmann, Kathrin Röggla, Christian Haller, Barbara Honigmann and Terézia Mora present their latest literary works.

Exhibition openings take place on the eve of the first exhibition day from 6 pm. Admission to the exhibitions is free on these evenings.

Sarah Morris. All Systems Fail 29.3.–4.8.2024





In her work, the British New York-based painter and film maker Sarah Morris (b. 1967) combines abstract painting with issues around modernity and power. Morris is interested in the systems that run through our lives in modern society, and how they are manifested in different cities and cultural contexts – from the architecture of large corporations via traffic to the digital infrastructure. The exhibition offers a comprehensive overview of the artist's career, including her work in film. The fifteen films that will be shown in cinema boxes in the exhibition are devoted to the dynamic of global metropolises such as Los Angeles or Beijing, and blend into an artistic unity with the paintings.

Brasil! Brasil! The Dawn of Modernity

7.9.2024-19.1.2025





In the first half of the 20th century artists in Brazil sought a modern artistic expression of their own. Particularly in the first decades, the European avant-garde – including Paul Klee – was just as important a reference as the country's own indigenous and Afro-Brazilian cultures. As well as parallels with the investigations of European modern art, differences consistent with the political, social and cultural situation also become apparent. The exhibition shows the different ways in which Brazilian artists developed their own modern pictorial languages. It presents ten artists and an introduction to formative political and economic events as well as milestones in the country's literature, music, design and architecture.

Permanent exhibition Kosmos Klee. The Collection





In 2023 the Zentrum Paul Klee installed the permanent Paul Klee exhibition Kosmos Klee. The Collection. The exhibition offers visitors a chronological survey of Klee's artistic career and presents some seventy works as well as biographical material and items from the archive that are regularly changed.

FOKUS exhibitions

FOKUS: Hamed Abdalla (1917–1985) 27.1.–26.5.2024

For the first time in Switzerland, an exhibition is devoted to the Egyptian artist Hamed Abdalla (1917–1985), pioneer of modern Egyptian art, who lived in Europe from the 1950s. He engaged intensively with Paul Klee and experimented with various techniques, with Arabic calligraphy forming a central starting point. As an artist of the Hurufiyya movement, which developed new artistic possibilities out of the Arabic alphabet, he invented his own 'creative words' by combining abstraction and human forms.

FOKUS: Architecture with Klee. From Mies van der Rohe to Lisbeth Sachs 1.6.–13.10.2024

Paul Klee's art and pictorial thinking were highly influential on numerous architects. Many bought one or several of the artist's works. Mies van der Rohe had the most extensive collection. Lina Bo Bardi and Aldo van Eyck bought one of Paul Klee's imaginary architectural representations, a selection of which are presented in the exhibition. In 1948, Carlo Scarpa designed the Klee exhibition within the context of the Venice Biennale and went on to adopt some of Paul Klee's principles of composition. The postwar generation of architects, including figures such as Aldo Rossi and the Swiss architect Lisbeth Sachs, also engaged with Klee's writing, taking particular interest in the artist's process-oriented work. The organic development of form in nature became a central reference in their sketches, and dissolved the rectangular severity. A particular focus will be put on the works of the hitherto little-known Lisbeth Sachs.

FOKUS: Journals of the Avant-Garde 19.10.2024–9.2.2025

The 20th century was the age of the avant-gardes. All over the world, movements formed with a desire for a radical redesign of the world and a rethinking of art. To spread their visions, many avant-garde movements published journals. These allowed a global exchange of artistic ideas, as happens today on the World Wide Web. The journals did not only contain manifestos, images and programmatic texts that could not be published anywhere else, but also embodied artistic visions in terms of design and typography. From the contemporary point of view these journals are not only unique art-historical sources; they also set standards in the history of design. For that reason, the exhibition casts light for the first time on journals as a central and globally deployed medium of artistic modernity, in which art and design, form and content become a single unit.

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
