Hamed Abdalla (1917–1985) was a pioneer of modern Egyptian art. For the first time in Switzerland, the Zentrum Paul Klee is devoting an exhibition to his work as part of the series FOKUS in a room in the permanent exhibition *Kosmos Klee*.

Egyptian artist Hamed Abdalla (1917–1985) is for the first time exhibited in Switzerland. Abdalla engaged intensively with European modern art and in particular with Paul Klee. From the 1950s, he lived in Copenhagen and Paris and always referred in his work to the hectic political situation of his homeland. Abdalla experimented with various techniques, Arabic calligraphy forming a central point. As an artist of the Hurufiyya movement, which developed the artistic potential of the Arabic alphabet, he invented his own "creative words", blending abstraction and human forms.

The works of Hamed Abdalla are being shown in the context of the series FOKUS. The room is part of the permanent exhibition *Kosmos Klee. The Collection*, which offers visitors a chronological survey of Klee's artistic career and presents some seventy works as well as biographical material and items from the archive that are regularly changed.

The opening of the exhibition will take place on **Friday, 26 January 2024, from 6 pm**. Admission to the exhibition is free on this evening.
